All: "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it; for God founded it on the seas and established it on the waters."

Leader: Holy One, draw us to you and your creation, our sibling. Unite us as your people in worship and in care for the earth and the seas.


All: Along with all creation we wait for your glory, O God, to be revealed. May we find freedom and healing for our land and water. Amen.

Gospel

John 10:11-18

[Jesus said:] ¹¹"I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. ¹²The hired hand, who is not the shepherd and does not own the sheep, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and runs away—and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. ¹³The hired hand runs away because a hired hand does not care for the sheep. ¹⁴I am the good shepherd. I know my own and my own know me, ¹⁵just as the Father knows me and I know the Father. And I lay down my life for the sheep. ¹⁶I have other sheep that do not belong to this fold. I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock, one shepherd. ¹⁷For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life in order to take it up again. ¹⁸No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it up again. I have received this command from my Father."

Repeat after the Leader: That's the story of God and God's people. God, thanks for your story.

<u>Dismissal</u>

Children are welcome to stay or are invited downstairs to continue reflecting on this story.



<u>Sermon</u>

Hymn of the Day 455: Crashing Waters at Creation



On this Earth Day Sunday we pray for the whole creation. God gathers these in addition to our usual prayers for the whole church and the whole people of God. We will return to wider prayers, including the prayer names, in worship next week.

Prayers of the People

BLESSING OF THE ELEMENTS Almighty and everlasting God, Creator of all things and giver of all life, we come before you for your blessing upon the seed, livestock, fields, and all things needed for a bountiful harvest. Grant that these may serve to your glory and the welfare of your people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Prayer for the Seeds: God you have given us seeds.

Creating God, you have given seed for the sower and bread to the people. Nourish, protect, and bless the seeds which your people sow in hope. By your loving and bountiful giving, may they bring forth their fruit in due season, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Prayer for the Soil: God you have created and given us soil.

Giver of life, we give you thanks that in the richness of the soil, nature awakens your call to spring. We praise you for the smell of freshly tilled earth, awakening blossoms, budding trees, the beauty of a cleanly sown field, and the freshness of new grass. We ask that you help us to be good stewards of the land. Bless the soil to bear bountifully, in the name of the one who gives us new life, Jesus Christ our Lord.

Prayer for Water and Rain: God, water is your creation.

Sustaining God, we receive the snows and the rains from you. We give you thanks for the smell of the earth after rain, for its welcome cooling, and its necessary hydration for the land. We ask that the rain come as often as it is needed so crops may flourish and the coming harvest be indeed bountiful, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Prayer for the Animals: God, the animals of the field are yours. Caring God, who created all beasts and cattle in a wonderful order and gave them into our care, make us good shepherds of all your creatures. We ask for knowledge to care properly for the animals you have given us, that they may be strengthen and free from disease, in Jesus Christ our Lord. Blessing of the Sower and Producers: God, the sowers and producers are yours.

We pray for all who care for the earth and its creatures, the water, and air that the riches of your creation may abound from generation to generation... Creator God, you make the grass grow for the cattle, and plants for people to cultivate. You give work as a gift for humans to participate in your creative activities on earth. You call us to produce from the land and your creatures, essential elements for nourishment and health for all. Bless all labor and grant wisdom, safety and a feeling of satisfaction in work. Enlighten us with faith to know your gracious purpose in rain or shine, fruitful work or breakdowns, is to serve you for your glory and give you thanks in all things. Amen.

Great Thanksgiving


The Lord be with you. And also with you.


The Lord's Prayer

Everyone is welcome to participate in communion. Today Hope offers bread, juice for dipping, prefilled juice cups with wafers, and pre-filled juice cups with a gluten-free wafer. You may choose to receive bread only and/or one of the cup options. Any version of communion carries the full power of communion. If you prefer not to receive elements, you may cross your arms over your chest for a no-contact, verbal blessing. You are invited forward to stand or kneel at the railing; after those who wish to come forward receive, servers will bring communion to those who prefer to stay in your seats.



Hope Leadership Update: Due to ongoing health challenges, Hope Council has received the resignation of Marianne M; we continue to pray for Marianne in her work with doctors and specialists. Hope council has appointed Steve M to continue Marianne's term, through December 2024, and eligible for re-election. Please reach out to any member of council with questions; and please continue to pray for their household.

Hope Property Next Steps: Hope's property process is nearing the next phase of sharing, education, and a congregational vote. Watch for updates in the coming weeks about a finalized Purchase and Sales Agreement (PSA) and how you can learn more about this document and the process overall. This is not the final sale, but if approved, does authorize the developer to take steps towards the final sale. Thanks to Hope's council and the many volunteers who have worked with Hope's lawyer and architect to negotiate the details of this PSA. **Sunday Stream Clean Up:** Today, **April 21**, from 3-5pm join a group from Humble Walk in cleaning up the stream outside Hope. They have all the materials and training you will need to collect trash, and maybe even remove invasive species. Caring for the stream closest to our property is just one tangible way to care for God's creation.
